- To strengthen the **role of WPSA in student development and capacity building**



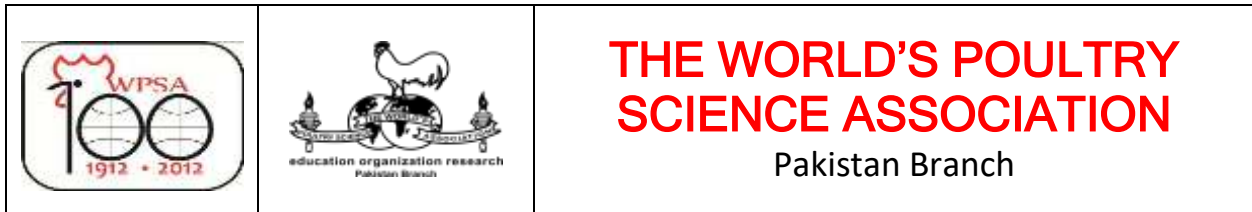

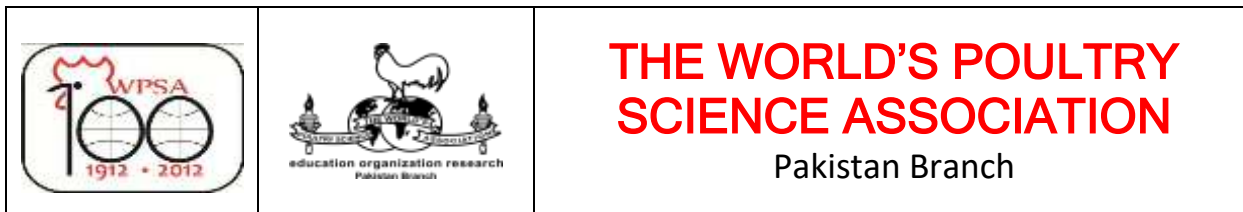


## Outcomes and Impact

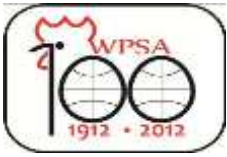
